

CHAPTER II

THE RIGHT TO CONSULAR ACCESS*

A. Introduction

You should read this chapter if you are a *citizen*¹ of a country other than the United States. Foreign citizens have the right to contact their consulate. Part B explains what your right to consular access means. Part C discusses why you might want to contact your consulate and why you might not want to contact your consulate. Consular officers (people that work for consulates) may be able to help you in criminal cases. For example, they can gather *mitigating evidence* (evidence helpful to you) that may help you avoid the death penalty. They may also help you if your rights have been violated. They will often help in deportation proceedings. Part D gives some practical advice on when and how to contact your consulate. Appendix A of this Chapter lists contact information for certain consulates, organized by country. Appendix B lists countries that have a *mandatory notification agreement* with the United States. This means that officials may notify (contact) your home country's consulate even if you do not want them to. Appendix C contains a short glossary of the italicized terms in this Chapter.

B. The Right to Consular Access

If you are a *foreign national*, you have the right to consular access. You are a foreign national if you are a citizen of a country other than the United States of America. You are also a foreign national if you are a *dual citizen* (a citizen of both another country and the United States). *Consular access* means that you have the right to contact your local *consulate* or *embassy* (representatives of a foreign country's government that work in the United States). You also have the right to have regular communications with consular officers from your home country.

If you are a foreign national: (1) the police must inform you of your right to consular access (just like they must inform you of your Miranda rights); and (2) if you want to talk to a consular officer, the consular officer must be allowed to call, write, or visit you in prison to answer your questions and offer you assistance. Also, if you request it, (3) the official who is holding you in custody must notify the nearest consulate or embassy of your arrest without delay. If you are from certain countries, officers must notify the nearest consular officials of your arrest or detention, even if you do not want them to.² See Appendix B for a list of these countries.

Your right to consular access is violated if officials did not notify you of your right to consular access. Your right to consular access is also violated if you were not allowed to communicate with a consular officer. It is important to bring up these violations in trial court and on appeal.³ You must

bring these issues up at trial so that they are “preserved” (the appeals court will be able to consider the issue. If you do not raise any violations of this right at trial and on appeal, you may lose the right to *habeas corpus review* (review of whether your imprisonment is lawful) of this issue in states that require you to first raise this issue at trial.⁴

1. Suing for Violations of the Right to Consular Access

Police violate federal law when they stop you from accessing a consular officer.⁵ However, it is not clear if individual people can sue law enforcement agencies for violating their consular rights. Usually, courts decide that international agreements or treaties do not create a *private cause of action*.⁶ This means that you do not have the right to sue a law enforcement agency for violating an international agreement because you are an individual citizen. Usually, only countries can sue for violations of the international agreements that they sign, even if their individual citizens are harmed.⁷

A few federal courts have decided that there is a private cause of action for violations of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations.⁸ But, other courts do not think there is a private cause of

action for violations of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations. In *United States v. Jimenez-Nava*, a Mexican citizen was arrested in Texas for making fraudulent (or fake) immigration documents.⁹ Police officers did not tell him about his right to consular access until after he was questioned about the crime. Jimenez-Nava sued, but the Fifth Circuit decided that he had no right to sue under the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations. Instead, the court applied the presumption (a legal assumption) that international treaties do not create rights that can be enforced by individual people.

2. The Effect of Violations of Rights to Consular Access on Convictions

What happens if the police or U.S. officials violate your right to consular access and you do not have access to your consulate until after you are convicted? In some cases where a defendant was sentenced to the death penalty, foreign countries have tried to stay (delay or stop) an execution order because the defendant's right to consular access was violated. These foreign countries argue that if the consulate had been able to get in touch with the defendant, they might have been able to help the defendant avoid the death penalty.¹⁰ This argument does not usually convince courts to stay (pause) executions.¹¹

In 2008, the Supreme Court decided *Medellin v. Texas*.¹² In *Medellin*, the Supreme Court found that the International Court of Justice's ("ICJ") decision did not have to be followed by state or federal courts in the United States. In *Medellin*, the Court also looked at how much legal power presidential orders have. The Supreme Court found that the President could not order states to follow ICJ decisions. The Court explicitly said that states do not have to review prisoners' convictions under the Vienna Convention if doing so does not follow their state rules. You may not be able to sue for violations of your right to consular access if you do not follow certain state rules.¹³

Some state courts have denied petitions seeking review of convictions for failure to provide consular access,¹⁴ since states can choose whether to follow ICJ decisions.¹⁵ In *Garcia v. Texas*, the Supreme Court ruled that the fact that Congress might enact legislation implementing the Vienna Convention in the future does not entitle a plaintiff to relief for an alleged violation of the Vienna Convention.¹⁶

If you or the police have any questions about consular rights and obligations under the Vienna Convention, you or they should contact:

After business hours, you can reach the State Department Operations Center at (202) 647-1512.¹⁷ If you ask to speak with your consulate and your request is denied, make sure to write down the date, time, and the name of the person who denied your request.

C. Why Contact the Consulate?

Under the Vienna Convention, it is your choice whether you want to talk to your consulate. You do not have to contact your home government. However, many countries have signed agreements with the United States that require U.S. officials to automatically contact your home country if you are arrested in the United States.¹⁸ This means that even if you do not want your consulate to know that you have been arrested, the police might tell them anyway. But, the police often forget or do not bother to call the consulate. If you want to talk to your consulate, you should always tell the police when you are arrested.

You should think carefully about whether or not you want to contact your consulate. Some consulates are more helpful than others. Based on what you know about your own government, you may

already know whether your home country's government would be willing to help you. Some consulates will send someone to visit you immediately, contact your family, and help you find a lawyer. Others have limited office hours and resources. Some cannot or will not visit incarcerated persons at all. Some governments have allegedly used their consular officers to harass political opponents.¹⁹ If you are in the United States because you are fleeing persecution in your home country, contacting your home government may not be a good idea.

At the very least, you should discuss the idea of contacting your consulate with a lawyer. Not all criminal defense lawyers know about the Vienna Convention, and they might not know that consular assistance is available. Your lawyer may not even know that you are a foreign citizen unless you specifically mention it. If you choose not to contact the consulate, you could contact a private organization instead. You can find contact information for some of these organizations in Appendix IV of the main *JLM*.²⁰

1. Consulate Assistance with Legal and Non-Legal Matters in Criminal Cases

Good consular officers will assist you in the following ways:

1. Visit you in prison (or even at the police precinct);
2. Explain to you what is going on;
3. Explain to you how the U.S. legal system works;
4. Contact your family members for you;
5. Help you find a lawyer;
6. Help locate your medical, military, or school records;
7. Provide you with emergency financial assistance; and
8. Make sure that you are being treated well in prison.

They can put pressure on the local government to protect your rights. They can provide your lawyer with interpreters, consultants, or investigators. Your consulate may be a good place to call if your lawyer tells you things that you do not understand, if you are not sure that your lawyer is good or trustworthy, or if you are trying to make an important decision such as whether to accept a plea bargain or whether to testify. For example, if you are not familiar with the plea-bargaining system in the United States, your consulate may be able to explain how it differs from the legal system in your home country. The consulate cannot prevent you from being tried for a crime in the United States, but it may help to make sure that you receive a fair trial.

It is usually better to call the consulate with specific questions or simple requests than to call and say "I need help" or "I'm in trouble." Consular officers are not lawyers. They usually cannot give you money for a lawyer. They might not take an interest in your case at all unless you are facing very serious charges. However, if you have a specific request—such as "Can you help me contact my mother back home," "Can you recommend a good attorney," "Can you help me get my medical records from my

home city,” or “Can you find a priest who will visit me in prison?”—the consulate may be able to help you even if you are facing only minor charges.

2. Gathering Mitigating Evidence in Death Penalty Cases

Not all consulates can help all criminal defendants. However, many of them are willing to help with death penalty cases. Many countries, particularly Latin American countries, have taken a strong stance against the death penalty. These consulates may be a big help to your defense attorney if you are facing a possible death sentence. Consulates can help your lawyer gather mitigating evidence, especially if the evidence is in your country of origin. Mitigating evidence is evidence that shows why you should not receive the death penalty.²¹ The evidence can show positive factors (for example, you care for your ailing grandmother, are a good student, or have never been in trouble before) or negative factors (for example, you were physically abused as a child or suffer from a mental disorder). Your lawyer presents this evidence during the sentencing phase of your trial.²²

A consulate may assist defendants in many ways. For example, in various cases involving Mexican citizens, the Mexican Consulate has organized testimony, helped locate and produce witnesses, written letters to judges and prosecutors, submitted affidavits to courts, met with defendants' lawyers to discuss plea bargains, arranged consular visits, verified records and documented family history, and assisted with translation.²³ Mexico, Ecuador, Canada, Paraguay, Honduras, the Dominican Republic, and Germany have shown a particular interest in death penalty cases. They have all tried to help defendants appealing the death penalty even when police failed to contact the consulate before trial.²⁴

3. Assistance When Your Rights Have Been Violated

Most consulates will help you if your rights are being seriously violated. If police or prison guards beat you, most consulates will step in to assist you. For example, members of the New York City Police Department beat and tortured a Haitian immigrant on August 9, 1997. The Haitian Consulate helped

bring public attention to his situation. They also helped encourage the United States government to charge the police officers who were allegedly involved.²⁵

4. Assistance with Deportation Proceedings

In some cases, you may face “removal” or deportation²⁶ from the United States. After your removal order becomes final and if you are returning to your home country by air, consulates are usually notified so that they can process your travel papers.²⁷ If you are facing deportation proceedings, you should be told about your right to contact your consulate. You should also be allowed to speak with your consulate before your hearing. This right is protected by treaties and also by a U.S. Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) regulation.²⁸ If DHS doesn’t tell you about this right before your removal hearing, some federal courts will find the order of removal invalid. In a case of criminal conviction for illegal reentry into the United States, courts might even reverse the conviction due to *prejudice*.²⁹ This means that if having access to your consulate could potentially have affected the outcome of your deportation proceedings, the court might reverse your conviction.³⁰ When you appeal a removal decision, you should always raise this claim of prejudice if your right to consular access was violated. If you do raise the claim, however, you will probably have to show that having access to your consulate could have potentially made a difference in the outcome of your removal proceeding.³¹

D. When and How to Contact Your Consulate

If you decide to contact your consulate, it is better to do it before you’re convicted of a crime. If you contact your consulate after you have already been convicted, they may not be able to help you as much. Several countries have tried to get convictions reversed based on Vienna Convention violations. So far, none of these attempts have succeeded. In 1998, a dual Paraguayan-Argentine national was convicted of capital murder in 1993. The United States government failed to inform the defendant

of his rights under the treaty when he was arrested. However, he was still executed.³² This situation demonstrates that you should call your consulate sooner rather than later if you think that it can help you. After your conviction, the consulate probably will not be able to get your conviction reversed. However, it may be better to contact your consulate late rather than not at all. They may still be able to help you in small ways and make sure that your rights are not being further violated.

If you cannot reach a consular office in an emergency, you might want to try your country's Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York City. Note that it is not necessarily the job of a UN Permanent Mission to provide consular assistance. Not all countries listed in Appendix A follow the Vienna Convention or any other consular treaty with the United States. However, most of them do.

All phone numbers and addresses listed in Appendix A refer to consulates and/or embassies (unless noted otherwise). Mail should be addressed to "Consulate [or Embassy] of [Your Country]," followed by the street address. If you decide to contact your consulate, it usually will not make a difference whether you contact the embassy or the consulate. Diplomats and consular officers will usually share information and help each other, especially in emergencies.

Most countries have an embassy with both diplomatic and consular officers in Washington, D.C. They also have the Consul General's main office (usually located in New York City) and your country's Permanent Mission to the UN. Some countries with many nationals living in the United States—for example Mexico—may also have regional consular offices in other cities. Some very small countries, such as Belize, may only have an embassy in Washington, D.C. Iran does not have formal diplomatic relations with the United States so it does not have an embassy or a consulate. Instead, Iran has an Interest Section within the Pakistani Embassy that performs limited services. However, most countries do maintain a Permanent Mission to the UN.

There are also many private organizations that help people of certain nationalities, perhaps even more so than your consulate. However, these private organizations (unlike your consulate) do not have any particular right to communicate with you or visit you under the Vienna Convention. They can certainly communicate with you in prison, just like any friend or relative, but they will probably not be able to visit you at the police station. They will not have the same right of access as your lawyer. For further information about your right to communicate while in prison, see Chapter 19 of the main *JLM*. For additional information about such organizations, check Appendix IV of the main *JLM*.

E. Conclusion

If you are a foreign national, you have the right to contact your local consulate or embassy. You also have the right to have regular communications with consular officers from your native country. You do not have to contact your consulate if you do not want to. However, certain states have mandatory notification agreements with the United States and may contact your consulate whether you want them to or not.

Under the Vienna Convention, the police must inform you of your right to consular access. If you request it, the official who is holding you in custody must ensure that the nearest consulate or embassy is notified of your arrest without delay. The consular officer must be allowed to call, write, or visit you in prison to answer your questions and offer you whatever assistance they want to offer. If you choose to contact your consulate, you should do so as soon as possible. A list of embassies, consulates, and private organizations that assist foreign nationals can be found in Appendix A of this Chapter.

GLOSSARY

Citizen

See JLM Immigration Supplement Chapter 1, "Immigration Law: The Immigration Consequences of Criminal Activity" for a definition of a citizen.

Consular access

You have the right to contact your local *consulate* or *embassy* (see below).

Consulate or embassy

The U.S. office of a foreign government. For example, Mexico has several consulates in the United States, located in various cities such as Chicago and New York.

Dual citizen

A citizen of both another country and the United States.

Foreign national

You are a foreign national if you are a citizen of a country other than the United States of America.

Habeas corpus review

Review of whether your imprisonment is lawful.

Mandatory notification agreement

Officials may notify your home country's consulate even if you do not want them to.

Mitigating evidence

Evidence helpful to you.

Prejudice

The violation of a right that potentially affected the outcome of your deportation proceedings.

Private cause of action

The right of an individual person to sue.
